Spiritual gifts are not the same as talents. They are spiritual strengths God gives us for being a part of His work in the world. This assessment and the list on the next page are tools to help you better understand the gifts God is expressing in you. We hope that this list provides a glimpse into the part God has for you in His body now.

REVEALING YOUR SPIRITUAL GIFTS



Your highest 3 scores and their corresponding letters have revealed some of your most prominent Spiritual Gifts. Read below to learn more about your particular gifts.

- A: Faith--The gift to trust God for what can't be seen and, pressing forward, to act upon the promises of God. (Romans 4:18-21; Hebrews 11)
- B: Service/Helps--The gift to identify and take the initiative to meet the practical needs of others in the church, freeing them to fulfill their own calling or to attend to personal needs or urgent matters. (Acts 6:1-7)
- C: Hospitality--The gift of helping others feel welcome, accepted, relaxed, and comfortable. (1 Peter 4:9-10)
- D: Teaching--The gift to proclaim and clearly explain God's Word in a manner that transforms the lives of others. (1 Corinthians 12:28; Acts 20:20-21; Romans 12:6-8; Titus 3:1-2)
- E: Encouragement--The gift to provide encouragement, comfort, reassurance, and support in ways that foster healing and wholeness. (1 Thessalonians 5:11; Romans 12:8)
- F: Mercy--The gift to detect the emotional pains of others; to feel compassion, listen, and provide loving-care. (Luke 10:30-37; Romans 12:8; Matthew 20:29-34)
- **G:** Giving--The gift to cheerfully contribute material resources above and beyond a tithe to others and the church. (2 Corinthians 8:1-7; Romans 12:8; Mark 12:41-44)
- H: Leadership--The gift to instill vision and to motivate and direct people to be faithful to their calling and responsibilities. (Romans 12:8; Hebrew 13:7, 17; 1 Timothy 3)
- I: Exhortation--The gift to stimulate faith and promote Christian maturity in others. (Romans 12:8; Acts 11:23,24, 13:43, 14:22)
- J: Administration--the gift to design and effectively execute plans managing people, resources, and time in order to reach the long range goals and objectives of the ministry team or church. (Titus 1:5; 1 Corinthians 12:28, 14:28-30)
- K: Intercessory Prayer--The gift to pray for extended periods of time on a regular basis and frequently see direct results to those prayers. (James 5:14-16, 1 Timothy 2:1-2; John 17; Colossians 1:9-12, 4:12-13; Acts 12:12; Luke 22:41-44

Heart has to do with our passions; the things that excite us, the things that give us joy, even the things that keep us awake at night. The things and people that we are passionate about are not by accident. The better we understand and follow our healthy passions, the more fulfilled we can be in joining in God's amazing work.



There are lots of personality tests out there! The one we've chosen is called "16 Personalities", which is a relatively short (~ 15 minutes), trait-based, and free online test. You may simply take the test and uncover your results, or go deeper with access to many free resources on learning about yourself, your motivation, identifying recurring patterns in your life, learning how to work better with others, and more.

One big takeaway - while this is an incredible tool for learning about yourself, the results of this test are not meant to be self-centered! In deepening your knowledge about yourself, your strengths and weaknesses, you will then have a deeper knowledge of how to serve alongside others in meaningful and positive ways. In being aware of other personality strengths and weaknesses, you will be better equipped to collaborate and connect with other disciples, all for the glory of God.


